Maths Skills and Challenges

YEAR 4

Estimate compare and calculate money in pounds and pence.
Read and make bar charts and time graphs.

YEAR 5

Multiplication and division.
Use multiple skills to solve complex mathematical problems.

Literacy Skills and Challenges

The pupils will be developing their skills to read aloud and edit their own work, and listen carefully to suggest improvements in the writing of others.

Writing: Skills include using complex sentences, introductions - such as opening sentences, titles, subheadings, editing and increasing vocabulary.

Spelling

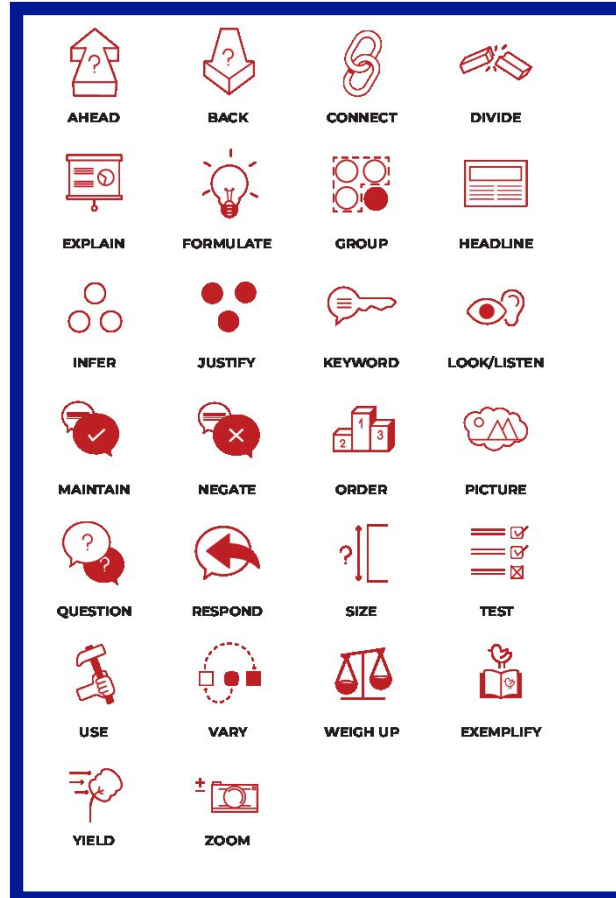
Looking at Suffixes:

To investigate, collect and classify spelling patterns of plurals. Try to collect plurals then group them according to how they are spelled.

Collect words that contain letters that do not make their original sound - such as city - the c makes an s sound. Can you find other letters that sometimes change their sounds?

Topic

Make links to music whenever possible - ask questions your child will need to research - is that an original track or a remake? Which instruments can you hear? Who made that? How was it made? How do you play it? Which song/instrument/composer came first/last?



Maths

Learning off by heart of the 8, 11 and 12 times tables.
