

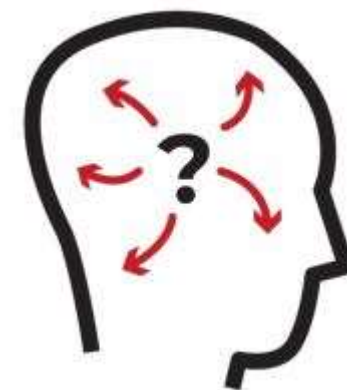

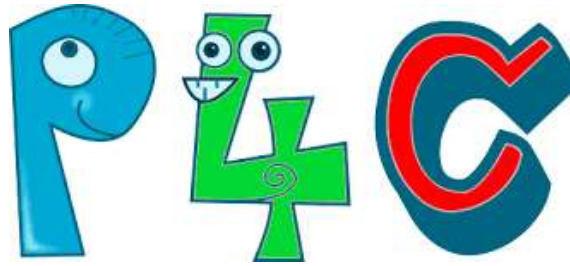
Thinking

What if?

What if questions are a fantastic way to encourage imaginative thinking:

- *What if dogs could read?*
- *What if I had a magic carpet?*
- *What if everything I touched turned to gold?*
- *What if everybody lied - all the time?*
- *What if it rained orange juice?*

If?... Then game

The first person starts with a question:

- *What if you were invisible?*

The next person responds:

- *Then I'd be able to play tricks on people.*

The first person then asks:

You can play this game in pairs or with the whole family over supper. At the end you can all say what you think was the **most imaginative idea**.

Rosen and Helen Oxenbury: We're going on a bear hunt. We're going to catch a big one. Will you come too?

Talking Points

- Would you like to go on a bear hunt?
- What if you really did meet a bear in the woods?
- What imaginary expedition would you like to go on, if you could choose anything you wanted?

Fun Activity

- Do a teddy bear hunt at home. Someone hides the teddy and everyone else has to find it.
- Be sure to make all the sounds as you go round the house:
 - Huff, puff up the stairs!
 - Whisper like a mouse in the bedroom!

Talking Points

- Is it a good idea to try out things we don't really understand?

- Take turns to pretend using the app. Say what you've used it for, and then you can all discuss what would happen if this was for real.

Thinking Moves game

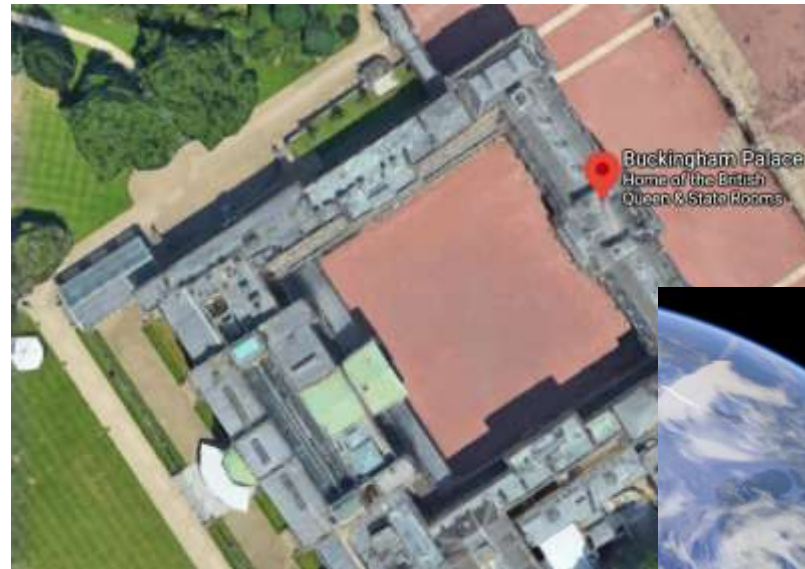
ZOOM out!
