damp**

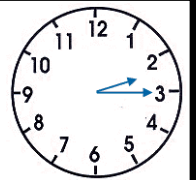

Numeracy focus - Time

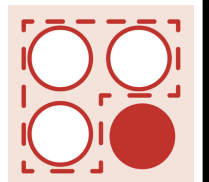
What is time?

What do you think you have in your house that is related to time? I want you to go and have a little look. Make a list of anything that you find related to time, or even take a picture.

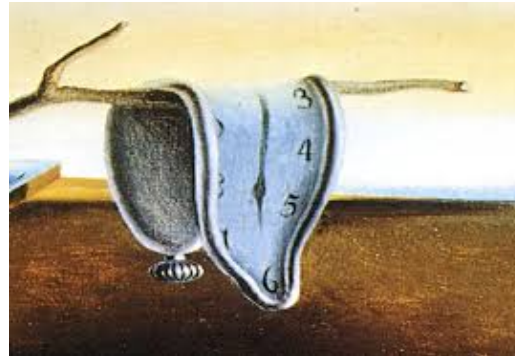


Next, I want you to try to **GROUP** them. A bit like using the sorting hat in
