
## **Suggestions for home learning**

# Spelling Looking at Suffixes:

# PLEASE listen to your child read from a story or poem or song lyrics everyday.

Reading out loud is a fabulous skill and develops confidence and comprehension as well as boosting happiness when your child sees you have stopped and listened to them.
