Spelling


<u>Look out for homophones!</u> Make a list of the different spellings and meanings. Practise putting them into sentences.

A **homophone** is a word that sounds the same as another but is spelt differently (e.g. *mail*, *male*; *to*, *too*, *two*). It must be recognised that sound is not necessarily an indication of spelling.

Share and discuss strategies you have for remembering how to spell tricky words, e.g. by saying choc-o-late, Wed-nes-day etc.

Topic
