Literacy

Rec Writing: Mark making and beginning to form recognisable letters. Working towards writing their name.

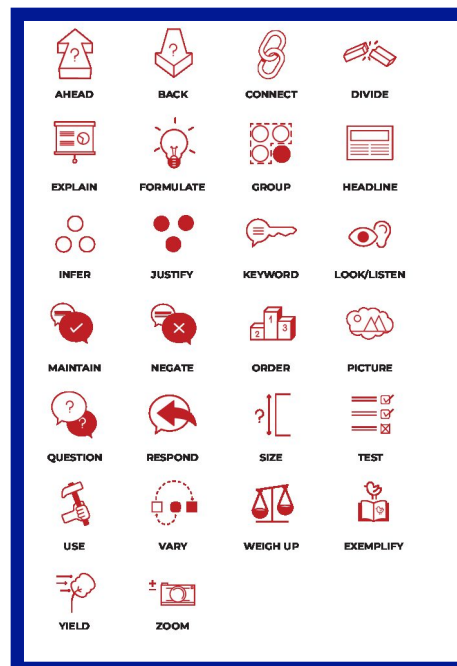
Rec Phonics/ Reading: To recognise their name. To begin to hear the initial sound of words. To start learning the phase 2 sounds. (Sound/ word mats will be sent home soon)

Y1 Writing: Writing simple sentences with spaces, full stops and capital letters

Y1 Spelling focus: Phase 2/3/4 HF words (Word mats in blue folders)

Y1 Phonics/ Reading: Daily phonics work Phase 2/3/4 Sounds & HF words. To retell simple stories and answer questions about what they have read.

Please listen to your child read daily.



Our Topic is Childhood!

This project teaches children about everyday life and families today, including comparisons with childhood in the past, using artefacts and a range of different sources.

Science: The children will learn that humans are a type of animal known as a mammal. They will have opportunities to name and count body parts and identify similarities and differences. They will learn about the senses, the body parts associated with each sense and their role in keeping us safe.

History: Use a range of historical artefacts to find out about the past.

P.E.: Weekly PE and yoga sessions, developing spatial awareness and balance. They will also participate in simple playground games, following the rules. Please have PE kit in school at all times

ART: Represent the human face, using drawing, painting, sculpture or collage from observation, imagination or memory with some attention to facial features

DT: Construct simple structures, models or other products using a range of materials.

PSHE: Work and play cooperatively and take turns with others. Form a positive attachment to an adult and friendships with peers. Show sensitivity to their own and to others' needs.

Music: Sing songs from memory and explore the sounds made from a variety of different instruments

ICT: Recognise the ways digital technology can be used in the classroom, home and community.
